



The Future of Children is a collaboration of the Woodrow Wilson School of Public and International Affairs at Princeton University and the Brookings Institution. The mission of the *Future of Children* is to translate the best social science research about children and youth into information that is useful to policymakers, practitioners, grant-makers, advocates, the media, and students of public policy. The project publishes two journals and policy briefs each year, and coordinates a variety of related outreach events. Topics range widely -- from income policy to family issues to education and health – with children’s policy as the unifying element.

Because the *Future of Children* aims to reach a wide audience with the best objective research possible, the articles contained in the journals are literature reviews that provide a balanced view of the literature and evidence, review both basic and "policy-relevant" research to highlight what we know as well as what works, and avoid using overly technical language. The project also supports numerous activities and conferences and an active website, including a blog and webcasts of many of our outreach presentations. In keeping with our commitment to reach a broad audience, we offer electronic versions of our materials and attendance at our outreach forums, free of charge. Print copies of the journal are often provided at no cost at our outreach events, and are also available for sale on our website.

The senior editorial team is diverse, representing two institutions and multiple disciplines. Editor-in-Chief Sara McLanahan is the Director of the Center for Research on Child Wellbeing and the William S. Tod Professor of Sociology and Public Affairs at Princeton University. Senior editors include Ron Haskins, Senior Fellow and Co-Director of the Center on Children and Families at the Brookings Institution, and a senior consultant at the Annie E. Casey Foundation; Christina Paxson, Dean of Princeton University’s Woodrow Wilson School of Public and International Affairs and the Hughes-Rogers Professor of Economics and Public Affairs; Cecilia Rouse, Katzman-Ernst Professor in the Economics of Education, Professor of Economics and Public Affairs, and Director, Education Research Section at Princeton University; and Isabel Sawhill, Senior Fellow and Co-Director of the Center on Children and Families at the Brookings Institution, and The Cabot Family Chair. *The Future of Children* is supported by staff at both Princeton and Brookings: the project is managed by Associate Editor, Kris McDonald and Project Manager, Lauren Moore Kase; journal articles are edited by Managing Editors, Brenda Szittyta and Marty Gottron; outreach activities are organized by Lisa Markman-Pithers and Mary Jones; and communications are coordinated by Regina Leidy.
