Immigrant children: A Future of Children report



Immigrant youth – defined as children under age eighteen who are either foreign-born or U.S.-born to immigrant parents – now account for one-fourth of the nation's 75 million children.

By 2050, they are projected to make up one-third of more than 100 million U.S. children.

Immigrant children are more likely to experience poverty and face significant gaps in school readiness and are less likely to have access to healthcare than their native-born peers.

This report presents critical information about children in immigrant families in the United States and highlights policies to support these children.
